"He has risen; He is not here"

It's Easter morning, and the tomb where they laid Jesus' body is empty. This is the central story of our Christian faith. Yet, a story about where Jesus is **not** to be found is hardly a helpful story for the women who came to anoint his body and for the men who came running to afterwards. In their discouragement they must have thought, "What else can go wrong?"

Had we been able to fix a video camera in place 2000 years ago to capture the moment of the resurrection, I don't think we would have seen Jesus wrestling a boulder out of place and waving a victory flag. More than likely, at best, a tremendous flash alone would have been captured. That flash would have been the morphing of the historical Jesus into the Resurrected Christ. The historic Jesus was limited to space and time. This is the one neither the women nor the men could find on that first Easter morning. Moreover, in all four gospels they are clearly told that graveyards are the last places where searches for the one who said, "I am the Resurrection," should begin. So the search for the historical Jesus was over. The search for the Risen Christ had just begun. The quest for the one who could be contained by space, time, sickness, pain, suffering, or even death was over. The pursuit for the one who could not be restricted by such things was just beginning. It is the Resurrected Christ, not the historical Jesus, whom we also seek out (though we can never completely separate one from the other). That is why we are called Christ-ians and not Jesus-ians.

When I honestly pursue him, I find him in all the telltale places he told us he would inhabit: the hungry, the thirsty, the sick and imprisoned. He is in the faces of the children, and he's in the couple who could never have a child. He is in the joy of the newly-weds, and he is in those struggling to keep their marriage alive. He is in the fire of the eyes of dreamers, and he's in the blank stare of those with Alzheimer's. He is in the daring, and he's in the meek. He is in the successful, and he's in those with low self-esteem. He lives in you, and he lives in me. Once we find the Risen Christ, we have to love him in all his disguises. This isn't easy, but nothing will be more rewarding.

This Easter Season, I give thanks for the way you reveal the Risen Christ. Archeology can tell me some things about the historical Jesus. However, only in my attempts to know and love you can I experience the Risen Lord. Experiencing the Risen Lord is what we are all longing for. When we encounter Christ, it is the joy of the first Easter morning all over again...and there is no joy like it!

On behalf of myself, Fr. Charlie, and the entire staff, may you know that joy always.


