


#### July 30th - Bluegrass Diamonds

# Jonathan Ryu

As my favourite pastime, music has always been a major portion of my childhood life, the piano being a brother whose emotional expressions make it ideal to interpret my emotions, whether it is classical, romantic, or contemporary. Being an only child and having to adjust to new classmates in Harrison Trimble High School as a part of my experience in skipping grade 7, and busy after a long victory streak in academic life, music was the ultimate solution to all.

My piano journey started back when I was 7 in 2011, with instruction from my mother. Since then, even after we arrived in Canada the same year, the music had been retained. Starting at the Moncton Music Festival back in 2017 (level 9), this year, I managed to achieve a major victory in Saint John, representing senior piano winners in its gala concert. I achieved second place in the Provincial Finals Competition for piano in Sackville as well. Recently, I had the opportunity to perform my first concert on June 25<sup>th</sup> at Parkland Riverview and was invited to perform at the Barachois Summer Festival of Music on July 26<sup>th</sup>.

Having been a violin member for two seasons with the New Brunswick Youth Orchestra and NBYO Chamber Ensemble since 2016, music has certainly taken a major part in my life. One example of the major events that have happened since includes the celebration of Canada's 150th birthday with a concert tour in Ottawa and Montréal.

As a Grade 10 student, my future goal is not to become a career musician, but to have it as a hobby throughout my life. All my hard times have been accompanied with music, and I wish it to be the same in the future.
