Exploring our Faith

“Greatness is found in unselfish service”

It is rather amazing when you think about it – what James and John do. The arrogance of it! Imagine! “Teacher, we want you to do for us *whatever* we ask of you ... Grant us to sit ... in your glory.” I can’t envision ever going to any teacher of mine and asking such a thing. Jesus’ final response is an explanation that for James and John and all the apostles, glory will involve service.

For the Christian, greatness is defined by service. We have some sterling examples of that in our tradition and in our lives. Think of people like St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta and the profound example of love and caring she offered to so many on the streets of India; St. Pope John XXIII who visited those incarcerated “since they couldn’t come to visit him” and passionately believed in the equality of all before God as “we are all made in God’s image, and thus all Godly alike;” St. Oscar Romero and his relentless crusade against the poverty, social injustice, assassinations and tortures of his country’s government, which led to his own assassination; and Pope Francis and his famous “who am I to judge” comment, who also reminds us that “we are all called to be holy by living our lives with love and by bearing witness in everything we do, where we find ourselves.” (GE#14)



Think of the service of our parents in our own lives – how many sacrifices they made on our behalf, how many times they put our needs and desires ahead of their own. My brother tells the story of Mom using money that she won to buy him new hockey skates, at a time when she didn’t have enough money to buy herself an extra pair of pantyhose. This is a small example, but I have countless others and I know you do too. When it touches us personally, we understand the greatness of service. As adults we recognize how much our parents loved us by these simple gestures of service.

Is this why, I wonder, it makes it so hard for us to read of clergy abuse? We expect so much more of our priests than that. Acknowledging they are human, we are still deeply disappointed when instead of being our servants, they are our betrayers. Is it why it is so difficult to tolerate clericalism? Pope Francis says clericalism “not only nullifies the character of Christians,” a character which Jesus tells us should be one of service to others, “but also tends to diminish and undervalue the baptismal grace that the Holy Spirit has placed in the heart of our people.”

There is grave danger when we place anyone on a pedestal. “Whoever wishes to be great among you must be your servant.” Servants don’t stand on a pedestal. They get about the work of building the kingdom – it is that which will enable us to sit in glory.

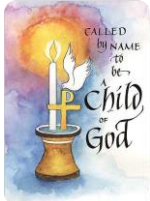


PARISHONERS IN HOSPITAL

Parishioners in Moncton City Hospital are reminded that if they want to receive a visit from the parish priest or pastoral care worker, it is necessary to identify themselves as being members of their specific parish when they are admitted to hospital. The *clergy visiting lists* for priests and pastoral care visitors are printed out according to parish identification. This means that if you haven’t identified yourself as belonging to our parish, the priest or pastoral care visitors will not be aware that you have been admitted to hospital and will not be able to visit. If for some reason you are not asked on admission, you or your family can ask your nurse to call the Spiritual Care Department and have your name added to the pastoral visiting and communion lists.

If a visit/communion is needed upon your return home from hospital, or move from home to another residence within the parish grouping, please inform the Parish Office so your name can be added to the pastoral visiting and communion lists for shut-ins.

Parishioners at the George Dumont Hospital are asked to contact the Parish Office if they wish to receive a visit from their parish priest or pastoral care visitor. Unfortunately, at the George Dumont Hospital, we are unable to generate a *clergy visiting list* according to parish identification. This means that if you or your family hasn’t contacted the Parish Office to inform us of your admission to this hospital, we will not be able to visit.

A Call for Compassion

Over the past month or so, our entire parish grouping has read information in the bulletin about fellow parishioner Alma Hamilton and her husband, Jamie Hamilton. For anyone who might have missed their story:

In May 2017, while visiting family in the Philippines, Alma and Jamie were asked a life-changing question. A niece, a young mother of two, was dying of kidney disease and she asked Alma and Jamie if they would be willing to adopt her two young children. Her request was to see 6-year old Kisha and 5-year old Carlos raised in Canada with two loving parents and a brand new life. It absolutely was, a life-changing question. Alma and Jamie returned home to Riverview and their decision was made - they would begin the lengthy and complicated international adoption process.



They are now coming to the final stages of that process and over these past 16 months have seen costs continue to mount. Most notably, by law, they must both return to the Philippines together this fall in order to be able to bring the children home to Canada. **This is where we come in!** If anyone wishes to offer support and encouragement to the Hamilton family, you are invited to do so by making a financial contribution to assist with the legal and travel expenses (use your church envelope and just mark 'Hamiltons' on the envelope with the amount) or you can come by the Parish Office. You can also offer words of encouragement and of course, let's all keep them in your prayers!

Update: *All the paperwork has been filed, signed and sealed and Jamie and Alma are waiting for their call to 'get on the plane'. Please keep them all in your prayers as the wait is incredibly stressful for everyone!*

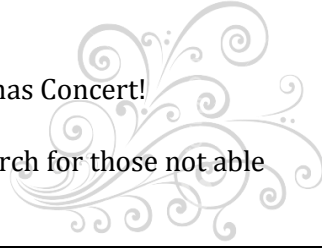
