Exploring our Faith

KEEP THE FAITH GOING!

This week's gospel reflects the importance of faith in our lives. It is a lesson about faith and reminds us that faith is sometimes found in unlikely places. Jesus commends the man, a Samaritan, for his faith, which has been his salvation.



The gospel made me think about the concept of faith. I had a very positive example of strong faith~ "living proof"~ in my mother. Her faith sustained her through many trials, early widowhood, health issues, the obstacles that can test a person's belief in God. She demonstrated what Mother Teresa stated, "Faith and prayer is the connection with God, and when that is there, there is service." My mom once said, "I don't know what tomorrow holds but I know who holds tomorrow. Hold on to your faith. Don't give up on God." Billy Graham stated, "The greatest legacy one can pass on to one's children and grandchildren is not money or other material things accumulated in one's life, but rather a legacy of character and faith." This was passed on to me. I can only hope to continue this legacy in my children and grandchildren.

Reflecting on faith, Nipsy Hussle said, "It sounds simple telling people to work hard and never quit, but to really execute and demonstrate those principles takes discipline and faith. Those are the two factors that I believe separate the good from the great, the successes from the failures. Another quote I read once stated, "I think faith is incredibly important because you will become overwhelmed with what's happening and you will have waves of grief, but when you turn to your faith, I believe God will give you waves of peace to get through it."

Pope John Paul II said, "May our faith be strong; may it not hesitate, not waiver, before the doubts, the uncertainties that philosophical systems or fashionable movements would like to suggest to us. May our faith be certain. May it be founded on the Word of God; on deep knowledge of the Gospel message, and especially of the life, person and work of Christ, and also on the interior witness of the holy spirit."

As Christians, we also celebrate **All Souls' Day** when, in our parish grouping, we will remember those we loved who were buried from our churches in the past year. This year, our **All Souls' celebration will be at Immaculate Heart of Mary Church on Monday, November 4th at 7:00 p.m.** and we encourage all to come and remember those who have gone before us. Also, throughout the month of November, a table will be set up in each Church to display the pictures of those buried from our churches this past year and candles will be lit for each at every Mass in November.

Redefining Palliative Care for the 21st Century with Pamela Mansfield, MD, Palliative Care Division Head, Moncton Hospital, Horizon Health Network, and Assistant Professor, Dalhousie University takes place on Saturday, October 19th from 9:30 a.m. to noon. Dr. Mansfield will explain that Palliative Care is for anyone with a life limiting illness; what we can do to help someone with a life limiting illness; and what leads to the request for medical assistance in dying.

End of Life Issues and Estate Planning: Thinking Outside the Box with Eileen Dennis, B.A., LL.B. a lawyer specializing in family, property and estate law, takes place on Thursday, October 24th from 6:30-8:30 p.m. Ms. Dennis will speak about Advance Care Planning and the importance of it; the need to have conversations with loved ones to ensure our end of life decisions are respected; and what should be in the will, and what should be clarified beforehand.
