DO NOT BE AFRAID

In the Gospel for this Sunday it states that Jesus said to His apostles, "Fear no one; for nothing is covered up that will not be uncovered, and nothing secret that will not become known. What I say to you in the dark, tell in the light; and what you hear whispered, proclaim from the housetops. Do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul." In saying these words, Jesus describes the worth of human beings in the eyes of God, who knows all things.

Fear is a part of life and part of each of our own daily lives. We are afraid of many things; failure, death, violence, the rise of terrorism and religious intolerance in our world and in our country. Apparently the words "Do Not Be Afraid" appear 365 times in the Bible. That's one for every day of the year! How can we cope with these fears? As a child, I learned that if I woke up in the middle of the night I should say a prayer, say my rosary and it would give me comfort because God was always there watching over me. It is very simplistic but it worked many times. I have my mother's rosary under my pillow to this day and I've often allayed my early morning anxieties by my childhood habit. Henri Nouwen stated, "When I trust deeply that today God is truly with me and holds me safe in a divine embrace, guiding every one of my steps, I can let go of my anxious need to know how tomorrow will look, or what will happen next month or next year. I can be fully where I am and pay attention to the many signs of God's love within me and around me."

"Do not be afraid" offers us hope, strength and courage when we are in doubt or struggling in any way. Mother Teresa said "*Inhale courage, Exhale fear.*" We are all capable of following the belief that God is always with us, trusting that we will receive love and always more love.

Richard Rohr phrased fear in an acronym:

False
Evidence
Appearing
Real

Maybe we should think about these words and realize that we CAN face what we think is fear. By living an authentic faith we can face hardship, can be empowered to live more generously, more trustfully and yet, more bravely.



Coming Back to Mass!

Depending on the size of the church, each Mass may have a maximum of 50 people in attendance. To reserve a place, you must call the parish office at 386-6178, Monday to Friday between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and noon. We will not take reservations outside of those hours and we cannot use email or texting as we need to speak with you when you call. There are specific questions we must ask you and some information that we must give you. A phone call is required.

- To start, we will celebrate weekend Mass at our four churches, as per the original schedule.
- Peoples Park Tower will have to wait a bit longer.
- No weekday Mass yet but we are starting Morning Prayer (live-stream).

When coming to Mass, we need you to:

- In the parking lot, stay safely 6 feet apart.
- At the church door, stop and allow the volunteer to check you in.
- Inside the door, stop and you will be given hand-sanitizer (your hands will be 'squirted' 😊).
- Inside the church, follow the volunteer to your assigned seat.
- During Mass, follow all arrows and markings on the floor, so we all stay safely 6 feet apart.
- During Mass, enjoy the Music Ministry, but for now, no singing in the pews.
- After Mass, respect the safety of keeping the 6 feet between you and your fellow parishioners while leaving the building and when out in the parking lot.

Dispensation from Mass

*We know that this is difficult but during the time of this pandemic, the **dispensation of Sunday Mass is given** for those who cannot go, for those who are fearful to go and for those advised not to go, to church. Rather, these faithful are invited to read the Word of God and to pray in their homes and to participate in the celebrations of the Mass via TV, radio and/or the Internet.*

People over 70, those with medical or at-risk conditions and those who are fearful to be out during this pandemic, are asked to assess their own risk and ultimately, to make their own decision. While we are happy to see everyone again, ultimately, we want everyone to feel safe and to remain healthy.

Note: St. Elizabeth of the Trinity will continue to live-stream Mass while we are restricted to a maximum of 50 people at each church. For now, live-stream Mass will continue to be from Immaculate Heart of Mary, and it will be at 10:30 a.m. on Sunday morning.

Wearing a mask is not mandatory, but it is encouraged. We even have some disposable masks at each church for anyone who asks for one. That being said, while masks are encouraged, when you're sitting in your pew, safely 6 feet away from others, you can certainly remove your mask, if you'd be more comfortable.
