Exploring Our Faith

DON'T TELL ME, SHOW ME!

I always like to imagine myself being in the group of people Jesus is addressing when I read passages of Scripture like we see in today's Gospel. We are told that Jesus is speaking to his Apostles, a group who have come to know him pretty well and, by this time, have grown somewhat accustomed to the challenges he places before them. Having said that, if I were tucked away in the corner of the room listening, I would be somewhat put-out, to say the least. I would be thinking: "So, let me get this straight. If I don't love you more than my father, mother, son or daughter, then, I am not worthy of you? Well, maybe I don't want to be worthy of you." That can be so like me, rushing to judgment without knowing the whole story.

These initial words of the Gospel remind me of my wife when she is trying to get my attention. She will often say a few things that will make me sit up and listen, and then, go on to tell me what she has to say. I think the same is happening here. Now that Jesus has our attention, here comes the really demanding part. The part that calls us out of our comfort zone and into action.

Saying you love someone can be easy. If a couple, who is in a long term committed relationship, counted how many times they would exchange the words: "**Love you; Love you too!**", while heading out the door for the day, going to bed, or just parting for a few hours, I think the number would surprise them. And, while I am sure these words are sincere, the true scope and meaning of them are not thought of every time they are spoken. The hard part is how you live them. What actions do these words call you to; that make them truly come alive.



This is Jesus' challenge to us today. It's not enough to just profess how much we love Jesus. It has to manifest itself in tangible action. It's like we're told in James 2:17, "*faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead*". I don't think it's an incredible leap to include love along with faith in this quote. Jesus tells us; if you love me, then your life is truly not about yourself. You must become welcoming to all, not just the people you like or agree with. You must be attentive to the most basic needs of people; including a cup of cold water on a hot day.

This all sounds great, but the question that will be in the back of a lot of people's minds will be: "What's in it for ME?" Jesus, in anticipation of this coming up, addresses it this way: "*Whoever gives a cup of cold water to one of these little ones---truly I tell you, that person will not lose their reward.*" And what is that reward? **Peace!** There is not much in this world that will provide us with more inner peace than doing a good deed, selflessly, in service to another. I would tell our children constantly when they were young: "you will never be truly happy until you figure out that your life is not about you."

The message for me in this Gospel: talk is cheap...you know the rest.

That we embrace each other, maybe not by a hug, but by the way we put others ahead of ourselves, keeping that 6ft distance, waving from across the driveway and blowing kisses at the camera to family members in other provinces.

Many Canadian cities and communities will have virtual Canada Day celebrations this year. Check out your local television channel at 1:00 p.m. on July 1st for a virtual tour of the celebrations both here at home and around the world!

Coming Back to Mass!

To reserve a spot at Mass, please call the parish office at 386-6178, Monday to Friday between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and noon. We will not take reservations outside of those hours and we cannot use email or texting as we need to speak with you when you call. There are specific questions we must ask you and some information that we must give you.

A phone call is required.

- To start, we will celebrate weekend Mass at our four churches, as per the original schedule.
- Peoples Park Tower will have to wait a bit longer.
- No weekday Mass yet but we are starting Morning Prayer on Thursdays at 9:00 a.m. (live-stream).

When coming to Mass, we need you to:

- In the parking lot, stay safely 6 feet apart.
- At the church door, stop and allow the volunteer to check you in.
- Inside the door, stop and you will be given hand-sanitizer (your hands will be 'squirted' 😊).
- Inside the church, follow the volunteer to your assigned seat.
- During Mass, follow all arrows and markings on the floor, so we all stay safely 6 feet apart.
- During Mass, enjoy the Music Ministry, but for now, no singing in the pews but we'd love for everyone to hum!
- After Mass, respect the safety of keeping the 6 feet between you and your fellow parishioners while leaving the building and when out in the parking lot.

Dispensation from Mass

*We know that this is difficult but during the time of this pandemic, the **dispensation of Sunday Mass is given** for those who cannot go, for those who are fearful to go and for those advised not to go, to church. Rather, these faithful are invited to read the Word of God and to pray in their homes and to participate in the celebrations of the Mass via TV, radio and/or the Internet.*

People over 70, those with medical or at-risk conditions and those who are fearful to be out during this pandemic, are asked to assess their own risk and ultimately, to make their own decision. While we are happy to see everyone again, ultimately, we want everyone to feel safe and to remain healthy.

Note: St. Elizabeth of the Trinity will continue to live-stream Mass and for now, that live-streaming will be from Immaculate Heart of Mary at 10:30 a.m. on Sunday morning.

Wearing a mask is not mandatory, but it is encouraged. We even have some disposable masks at each church for anyone who asks for one. That being said, while masks are encouraged, when you're sitting in your pew, safely 6 feet away from others, you can certainly remove your mask, if you'd be more comfortable.
