Jesus, ascending into Heaven, has not left, deserted, or abandoned us. He is with us when we gather to break bread with each other. He is with us when we reach out to help and support each other. These are the signs that Jesus is in us and with us today and forever. We also should reflect on His words (at the end of today's Gospel reading), "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."






