

Exploring Our Faith

A Little Irish

A few years ago, someone close to me learned through DNA testing that one of the parents who raised her was not a biological parent. This sent waves of shock through her family, in part because half her DNA was from an entirely different race of people with a different language and culture. "Your ancestry DNA certainly sounds more interesting than mine," was my response, which I now know was cavalier, given the personal and emotional upheavel she was experiencing. This news was shocking mostly I think because at the age of 65, she learned her identity was different than what she had known her entire life. In one sense, this did not matter because to me she was the same human being I had known and loved my entire life. Nothing had changed. But if you were to ask her, she would have told you that everything had changed because with all possible parents dead by then, she was left with unanswered questions about the story of her family. If you have submitted your DNA for analysis to one of the many organizations offering the service, you are granted access to a list of thousands of people from around the world who have submitted their own DNA for analysis and with whom you share DNA. You can easily communicate with these people via email or other messaging service, so reaching out and attempting to forge relationships with her newly found biological family played an important part of my friend's life. A life-long Christian woman who loved her family and all of Creation, she would never have said she hated her life. At the same time I admired the courage it took for her to step away from what she had known into the completely new and unknown territory of meeting relatives from a different walk of life.

My DNA story is fairly typical of someone born in Atlantic Canada in the early 1970s; mostly French and other assorted European. My mother was a LeBlanc with connections to the Bourque, Richard, and Bourgeous families, among other familiar names. My father was a Droesbeck, whose grandfather immigrated to Canada from Belgium but had strong German connections. After I submitted my own DNA for analysis the greatest surprise has been that 19% of my DNA was Irish. "Oh Danny Boy!" I could celebrate St. Patrick's Day like a real Irish person at O'Donahue's in Miramichi. To be honest most of what I knew about Ireland involved St. Patrick, *Angela's Ashes*, and the (1991) film *The Commitments* (which you should really watch by the way).

I was reminded of a time several years prior when one of my Theology professors returned to me my final paper for the course with the comment, "You have a Celtic soul." I had not heard of such a thing before, and at the time I did not understand what she meant, but it sounded kind of interesting to me, maybe something to do with wind instruments.

According to U.S. Catholic,

Celtic pre-Christian culture, dating back to 500 B.C.E., permeated the land, and these beliefs also strongly influenced Celtic spiritual practices. As a result, much of Celtic Christianity can be characterized by a strongly incarnational theology: The natural world, in particular, reveals the sacramentality of all creation. Matter is infused with the divine presence and offers glimpses of the world behind the surface of things. This spirituality celebrates the human imagination, cultivating creativity through various art forms such as manuscript illumination and vibrant metalwork. As I read about Celtic spirituality and Celtic Christianity, I noticed some of its characteristics (dreams, landscapes,



water, solitutude, silence, seasonal cycles, etc.) echoed strongly through my own personal spirituality, and inform how I (try to) live out my faith despite my Germanic surname.

So on this Feast of St. Patrick when we are all a little Irish, may the road rise up to meet you. May the wind be always at your back. May the sun shine warm upon your face; the rains fall soft upon your fields and until we meet again, may God hold you in the palm of His hand.

Adults, as we prepare to celebrate God's mercy and love through the sacrament of Reconciliation, the following examination of conscience is offered for us to reflect on ahead of time. As with all sacraments, it is always a good thing to prepare ourselves interiorly. It is like preparing the soil before planting. The celebration, this coming Thursday, **March 21**st @6:30p.m. at Immaculate Heart of Mary, will be for both children and adult. The gospel reading will be about the foolish man who built his house on the sand and the wiseman who built his house on a rock. Eight children will be with us that evening and will be celebrating their First Reconciliation. Please hold them in your prayers. Before pondering this examination of conscience, you may want to read Matthew 7: 24-27.

Is protecting human life at all its stages and promoting the dignity of every human being a priority in my life?

Can I celebrate the good fortunes of other people, or am I secretly jealous and despise them?

Do I give special attention to the needs of the poor and vulnerable in my community and in the world?

Do my purchasing choices take into account the hands involved in the production of what I buy? When possible, do I buy products produced by workers whose rights and dignity were respected? Do I see my care for creation as connected to my concern for poor people, who are at most risk from environmental problems?

Do I respect my body as a temple of the Holy Spirit? Do I see others in the same way?

Am I grateful for all that God has given me? Or do I compare myself to others and feel that God has short-changed me?

Do I lift up vulnerable people throughout the world in my prayer, or is my prayer reserved for only my personal concerns?

MESSAGE FROM THE BISHOP OF MONCTON FOR SHARE LENT 2024

Re: Development and Peace - Caritas Canada Share Lent Campaign 2024 Celebration of *Solidarity Sunday*, March 17, 2024, 5th Sunday of Lent

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Since February 14, Ash Wednesday, we have been in Lent, a liturgical season that prepares us to commemorate the passion, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Each year, the Church proposes a series of fasting, prayer and sharing gestures that offer us the opportunity to draw closer to God, to Jesus, and to our brothers and sisters in need at home and abroad.

If these three gestures are inseparable to live our Lent to the full, I'd like to underline the importance of sharing, in particular the Share Lent of Development and Peace - Caritas Canada, the official international solidarity organization of the Catholic Church in Canada and the Canadian member of Caritas Internationalis. In Africa, South America, Asia, Eastern Europe and the Middle East, Development and Peace supports partners who accompany local communities whose members are actors in their own development. The organization also responds to requests for humanitarian aid during natural and man-made disasters.

This year, Development and Peace invites us to show solidarity with peasants around the world, and to mobilize for the recognition, protection and guarantee of their rights to land, water, seeds, biodiversity, food sovereignty, a healthy environment and decent livelihoods. Under the theme Create Hope – Reaping our Rights, three partners are highlighted. They work in Bolivia, Indonesia and Nigeria respectively. They face a number of challenges, caused in particular by climate change and the excessive exploitation of extractive resources.



That's why, on March 17, the 5th Sunday of Lent, also known as Development and Peace Solidarity Sunday, I encourage you to carry our brothers and sisters affected by poverty in your thoughts and hearts. On this nationwide Sunday, the bishops encourage the members of the Christian communities of their dioceses to pray for peace, to bear witness to the work of Development and Peace, and to make a donation in the Share Lent collection or online at www.devp.org/fr.
