Throughout the month of November, a table will be set up in each Church to display the pictures of our dearly departed and candles will be lit for all at each Mass in November.



Following our Faith

EVOLUTION, CREATION, AND THE WONDER-FULL MESS OF IT ALL

Nature, without any coaxing, gives us the four seasons of spring, summer, autumn, and winter. Similarly, the Church give us the liturgical seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, and Ordinary



Time. There is something to be celebrated with each season both within nature and the Church. Each season wants to give us something but also wants something of us...a response.

Another season the Church has given us, more recently, is the Season of Creation. It was started back in 1989 by Ecumenical Patriarch Dimitros I when he declared September 1st as the Orthodox Day of Prayer for Creation. Subsequently, through

the work of the World Council of Churches, this one day of prayer grew into the "season" of creation extending from September 1st to October 4th, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, annually. In turn, in 2015 Pope Francis made the Season of Creation official for the Roman Catholic Church.

Long before the establishment of the Season of Creation, St. Francis of Assisi had already prayed, "Praise be to you, my Lord, with all your creatures." With this simple but profound prayer, he has encouraged believers of many generations to recognize creation as the fruit of God's eternal love. It seems love cannot contain itself; it always wants to create. God's eternal love wants to create eternally. Like the legendary Energizer Bunny, God's creative power goes and goes and goes. Creation, God's creative

power, is still flowing unhampered. Most of us thought, or still think, of creation as a 6-day event that happened eons ago never to happen again. The cosmos, including our common home of the earth, was often seen as a windup toy or clock set in motion by the Divine once and forgotten. Without accepting to expand our consciousness a little, now and again, it becomes too easy to picture God creating the world, winding it up, walking away, and saying, "Good luck."

The other extreme is the "controlling God." This is a god (not the real God) who needs to control, dominate, manipulate and put punishable constraints on every one of our endeavors. In the words of my father (91-years-old), reflecting on his youth, "Everything was a sin!".

One scenario leaves us with God hardly caring at all, never taking a seat at the table of any of your pains nor joys...just not engaged. The other leaves us with a manipulative God whose over-reaching arm

violates our free will, basically turning us into mere robots. This all-or-nothing approach was similar to the backdrop that divide people into the creationist camp (God alone created and did it all before the sun set on the sixth Day) versus the evolution camp (God's intervention is not needed). This either/or thinking leaves no room for a third possibility, a both/and approach, the Judeo-Christian approach.

Recently, a parishioner gave me a book entitled <u>Come, Have Breakfast</u>, words of the risen Lord in John 21:12. The author, Sr. Elizabeth Johnson, early on in the book marries the idea of evolution and

creation. She writes, "God's creative activity brings into being a universe endowed with the innate capacity to evolve by the operation of its own natural powers, making it a free partner in its own creation." That one line made me think of parents and their children. A parent, along with God, co-creates a child. However, the child continues to evolve over their lifetime. No parent controls how a child will evolve into adult-hood (although sometimes you wish you could). A good parent mimics God in that the parent loves and guides that child at every step of that's child's journey. While evolving, God never ignores us nor controls us, but walks with us at each step coaxing us to become all we were meant to be. Sr. Elizabeth writes, "It's as if the Creator gave the world a push saying, 'Go, have an adventure, see what you can become.'" It's never either creation or evolution; it's always both creation and evolution.

That push to adventure wasn't just for humans, but all the world, all created things. God's creative power is still at work in the world. Let's be attentive to the process. Let's be attentive to the gift of the earth. When we care for it, it abundantly gives us all we need...and then some. $\mathcal{F}r$. $\mathcal{P}WU$
