This territory is covered by the "Treaties of Peace and Friendship" which these nations first signed with the British Crown in 1726. The treaties did not deal with surrender of lands and resources but, in fact, recognized Mi'kmaq and Wəlastəkwiyik title and established the rules for what was to be an ongoing relationship between nations.



St. Elizabeth of the Trinity pastoral unit is pleased to present the three-part series, Dying with Christ –Living with Hope. Developed by the Christian Medical and Dental Association (CMDA), this program explores topics related to death and dying in a Christian context.

The purpose of the series is to help those who are searching to understand the meaning of a Christian death and how it fits into God's plan. It can help participants find strength in their faith and in their ability to articulate a Christian approach to these issues.

Exploring Our Faith

What's Your Focus, Love or Fear?

While this greeting might be coming a couple of weeks late, I would like to wish each of you a very Happy New Year! Each new year celebration brings with it a sense of new beginnings; of resolutions to do things differently; a sense of optimism that this year we are going to do it better than ever. The reality is that we haven't been getting it that wrong in past years. There are always things we would like to improve or bad habits we wish we could break, but I think that is our reality any time of the year, not just on January 1st.

The other event that we celebrate at this time of year is the baptism of our Lord. For me, this invites me more into self-reflection than the changing of month and year on the calendar. As I read the familiar story of Jesus' baptism, I am struck by the fact that each account of his baptism in the three gospels that write about it finishes with the same line. A voice from heaven (presumably God's voice) saying: "You are my Son, the beloved, with whom I am well pleased."

If God is saying this about Jesus, I believe God is saying this about each and every one of us. That we are God's child, and that God is well pleased with us. I wonder if we are comfortable with the idea that God is well pleased with us. Many Christians I encounter are more focused on what's wrong with them than what's right. Much of our prayer, both personally and publicly, is filled more with saying I'm sorry than saying thank you. Even within mass, on five different occasions we are telling God how sinful we are and how much we need forgiveness, while only once do we have a prayer of thanksgiving (Prayer after Communion), yet Eucharist literally means to give thanks.



I am not saying that we should go around thinking we are the greatest thing since sliced bread or that we don't need to reflect on times when we haven't been at our best, but I believe we need more balance. I can honestly say that I am not the greatest thing since sliced bread, but I am also not the worst human being God has ever created. When I began my job here at Saint Elizabeth of the Trinity and was introduced to the folks in the 5 churches we serve, I told each

congregation that I was part time sinner, part time saint. I believe that applies to each one of us. None of us get it right all the time and none of us get it wrong all the time, and the wonderful thing about that is Jesus spent most of his time with people who got it wrong, a lot.

I have been doing baptism preparation in our diocese for over 25 years and it always strikes me when talking to young parents about why they have decided to have their child baptized, how much of their motivation is fear based. They are so afraid that if something were to happen to their child before being baptized, there would be no place for that child in God's kingdom. We have spent so many years touting fear of God as a trait to be admired *(how many times have you heard the saying, "he is a good God-fearing man")* that we have almost stopped talking about love of God, and more importantly, God's love of us. When people quote scripture to me, they never say, "Mark, there is nothing you can do that will separate you from the love of God." (Romans 8:39). Why not? That is really **GOOD NEWS!**

So, maybe that can be my focus (or resolution) for 2025, to live from a place of gratitude for being so infinitely loved and to do my best to share that love with anyone God puts in my path. I believe that will be wellpleasing to God.

On December 30th, 2024, the Honorable Dominic LeBlanc, Minister of Finance and Intergovernmental Affairs, along with the Honorable Élisabeth Brière, Minister of National Revenue, announced that the federal government intends to amend the *Income Tax Act* to extend the deadline for making donations eligible for tax support in the 2024 tax year, until February 28, 2025.

This extension will mitigate the impacts of the four-week Canada Post mail stoppage. This will provide donors with additional time to ensure their contributions are received and processed by their parish.

The government will introduce legislation affecting these changes once Parliament returns in the new year.
