The treaties did not deal with surrender of lands and resources but, in fact, recognized Mi'kmaq and Wəlastəkwiyik title and established the rules for what was to be an ongoing relationship between nations.

Exploring Our Faith



Today's Gospel relates the story of the wedding at Cana. Jesus performs His first miracle by turning water into wine. This miracle shows Jesus' power and care for others. As a child, I remember the wedding feast at Cana and Jesus' first miracle. What I perceived was that Jesus changed the water into wine because His mother asked Him to. I felt that if Jesus - who is God obeys His mother and does what she says, I should also listen to my mother, do what she asks and not disappoint her. Mary was always a strong spiritual role model as I was growing up. At Confirmation I chose the name " Mary" to add to my name (back in the late 50s early 60s that was the custom). I thought that if I prayed to Mary, she might intercede for me and ask Jesus to listen to my prayers. Why? I thought that at the wedding feast at Cana, her request to Jesus showed her trust in His ability to help. She served as an example of faith, trust and intercession. Just as she asked

Jesus to help at the wedding, we can ask her to intercede for us with her Son. This miracle was a product of Jesus' generosity. He generously accepted to help out with this gift of a miracle. Through this , Jesus taught us exactly how we should use our gifts for the good and growth of God's people.

This is a perfect segue from the message Paul conveyed in today's second reading. In the second reading, Paul talks about the Holy Spirit giving different gifts to people. These gifts are meant to help the community and show God's love. Paul lists several gifts such as wisdom, knowledge, faith and healing, mighty deeds,

prophecy, discernment of spirits, speaking and interpreting different languages. When we use our gifts together, we can do great things for our community and the Church. In some other parts of his writings, Paul lists examples : service, teaching, giving, leadership, mercy, hospitality, administration, evangelism and pastoring. One characteristic of all these spiritual gifts is that they are given to us in order to be used to serve others. No spiritual gift is given to us strictly for our own benefit. They are not the same as natural talents. Spiritual gifts must be developed and allowed to work in us.



This makes us think of our own spiritual gift. It takes time to discern what gifts you have been given. Think about what opportunities give you great joy. Ask others around you what they find you to be very good at. I can think of some people who are so very good at just sitting and listening to one's problems or others who so pleasantly serve people in their job at convenience stores or the grocery store, or those who look after a parent who is suffering from dementia. These people would say " I'm not doing anything special " but in reality they are. They are examples of people using their spiritual gifts as God has asked them to do. One should take some time to reflect on and pray about what gifts you have been given by God. Then , put them into action. Every person has at least one spiritual gift - you just have to figure out what it is and use it to serve others. Each person's unique gift is necessary for the church to function as well and build a stronger and more loving community. You never know what a " miracle " you can be in someone's life.
