

EXPLORING OUR FAITH

Black and White

The story of Jesus's triumphant entry into Jerusalem amid the cheering crowds and subsequent persecution by the jeering crowds strikes me as comical in the dramatic 180 degree reversal of fortune. It reminds me of when Jesus began his ministry in Galilee surrounded by admiring crowds listening to him attentively in the temple only for them to drag him to a cliff shortly thereafter with the intention of throwing him off of it. For me the comedy part comes in the form of hyperbole, or exaggerated opposites.

One perspective sees the whimsical crowd as fickle in their admiration, holding up Jesus one way in the first instance and in a completely different way in the second. An enthusiastic reception by the same group demanding his death by crucifixion days later. I love you I hate you I'll kill you.

Another approach would have different crowds, each seeing a very different person when they looked at Jesus, one admiring him and the other condemning him. In either case what interests me is how Jesus is seen so dramatically different between one group and the next. How must that have felt to go from lauded to reviled? Would that leave you feeling conflicted? Even under these circumstances, Jesus remembered who he was, the one who loves to the extent that on the cross he continued to ask God to forgive those who were responsible for those inflicting pain and suffering.



If we want to test whether we truly belong to Christ, let us look at how we behave toward those who have hurt us. The Lord asks us to respond not as we feel, or as everyone else does, but in the way he acts toward us. He asks us to break out of the mindset that says: "I will love you if you love me; I will be your friend if you are my friend; I will help you if you help me". Rather, we are to show compassion and mercy to everyone, for God sees a son or a daughter in each person. He does not separate us into good and bad, friends and enemies. We are the ones who do this, and we make God suffer. (Pope Francis' Palm Sunday Address, April 2022)

In a culture that places such high value on fitting in and tit-for-tat transaction, I have found Pope Francis' words pose a challenge and they once again call me out of my comfort zone because how is it possible to understand and embody God's unconditional love or the concept of grace if I am judging people and categorizing them? Paul told us last week that "For his sake I have accepted the loss of all things and I consider them so much rubbish, that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having any righteousness of my own based on the law but that which comes through faith in Christ..." (Philippians 8:3-14) and the week prior to that "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting their trespasses against them and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation." (2 Corinthians 5:7-21)

From my perspective, the task set out before me is clear, so when Jesus prayed for the forgiveness of his enemies as he died, I hear a radical call to pray for the transformation of my human inclination to do the exact opposite.

For all of us who are challenged by this radical modeling of love of enemies, it is helpful to note that Jesus' statement is a prayer. Whatever may have been Jesus' interior readiness to forgive, the fact that it is expressed as a prayer of petition gives a helpful option to followers of Jesus who find forgiveness of unrepentant adversaries next to impossible. What may not come spontaneously from the human heart can be requested in prayer. (Dennis Hamm, SJ)

I wish everyone a blessed Holy Week, and want to share some solid words of advice from Lutheran pastor Nadia Bolz-Weber; "Jesus will rise from the dead even if you forgot to print out the right hymns, even if the lilies arrive already wilted, even if the whole choir gets food poisoning. Nothing will keep the stone from rolling away."


