### **R.C.I.A**

When people asked Jesus about His way of life, He told them to **"come and see"** (John 1:38-39). He taught these followers His way of life through stories, teachings, questions and experiences. He gave them opportunities to commit themselves to Him more deeply until they could say with St. Paul, "the life I live now is not my own; Christ lives in me" (Galatians 2:20). The early Church followed Jesus' example, inviting inquirers to **"come and see"**, teaching them and leading them through stages of commitment to a new life in Christ. This is RCIA, the process of initiation used by Jesus and by the early Church, adapted to meet today's needs.

**RCIA** stands for **"Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults"**. RCIA requires a modest commitment in time but we think you will find the process a lot easier than you might expect. In addition, we have found that everyone who becomes involved, young or old, finds it to be a wonderful experience.

**An invitation is extended to...** Those who are **unbaptized**

Those **baptized** in the Catholic Church, but have not received the sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation

Those **baptized** in another Christian Church who have had little to no faith development and are interested in learning more about the Catholic Church.

We generally meet every two weeks from **6:30-8:00 p.m.** for sharing, teaching, and questioning. RCIA helps a person become acquainted with the liturgical life of the church and the faith community before making a commitment to the Church. You are welcome to join us at any time throughout the year.

**The Queen of Peace** - On September 19, 2024, the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith, with the assent of Pope Francis, grants approval for devotion link to Medjugorje. The Holy See recognizes the abundant spiritual fruits received at the Sanctuary in Medjugorje: healing, conversion, messages of peace. "We can see a nucleus of messages in which Our Lady does not place herself at the center but shows herself to be fully directed toward our union with God." The Vatican has not yet made any declaration regarding the supernatural nature of the Marian apparitions, as reports of these apparitions are still ongoing.

Once the apparitions cease, the Vatican will be able to begin its investigations.

A special bilingual Mass will be celebrated at St. Bernard's Church on Wednesday, June 25, 2025, to commemorate the Queen of Peace.

# Exploring Our Faith

## *I Have Kept the Faith ...*

Last weekend we were in the Annapolis Valley visiting our friends, the Hebb's. Upon returning, I finally had a chance to look at the readings for this Sunday. Coincidences, I have been told, are God's way of remaining anonymous. There could be no more appropriate reading for Wayne and me after that weekend, than the second reading we hear proclaimed today.

Today the Church celebrates Saints Peter and Paul – early leaders of the Church. One was given the responsibility of building the Church; the other dedicated his life to spreading the Word of God.

The first reading from the *Acts of the Apostles* indicates that Peter is expecting to die. Herod has already killed James, and arrested Peter who is heavily guarded as he awaits being presented to the people for judgement. In his letter to Timothy, proclaimed in the second reading, Paul tells him that his own death is imminent, and he is passing the torch to Timothy to continue the mission. In the Gospel, Jesus prepares Peter for a time when he will no longer be with them, telling Peter "I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven."



Our friend Terry is dying. He never speaks of it - to us at any rate - but his body is telling him and us, that the end is coming – maybe weeks away, maybe days away. Only God knows that. Despite his failing health, exhibited by this weakening body, difficulty communicating, extended periods of rest, loss of independence, changes in appearance, there are still many indications of the man we have known and loved for many years. While he struggles to process what we say, or what we ask, or to even engage in extended conversation of any type, periodically, his beautiful laugh rings out at just the right time in response to some witty, or ranting, comment. That trademark deep chuckle is one we have heard countless times over our years of friendship. His two-year journey has brought about many changes; yet the essence of Terry remains.

"I am already being poured out as a libation, and the time of my departure has come. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." Haunting words. To be able to say, at the time of your "departure," that you have fought a good fight, and even to the conclusion of your life, remained a person of faith – regardless of what you have encountered, any challenges you have faced, any time you have been less than God ever meant you to be, what a lovely tribute to make of someone.

A close friend of Marilyn's chastised her recently for not thinking Terry may be completely cured – 'he could experience a miracle,' she said. After all, as we know from the first reading, Peter received a miracle that saved him. Yet sometimes I think we confuse miracle with magic. All those who love Terry want his diagnosis to be different. However, death comes to everyone, and what better miracle than to spend your last days with someone who loves you enough to provide the compassionate, patient attention and care you need during these final weeks. To have someone in your life, who has put aside their own plans and dreams and makes you and your needs their priority. To have someone who, through their words and actions, reminds you every day that you are loved and worthy of their time. And through this miracle, allows you to keep your faith, finish your race and continue to fight that good fight with dignity and hope.

I have witnessed the death of too many people I have loved. In every case, they have been supported and accompanied by spouses or others. How blessed. That for me is the miracle. "The Lord stood by me and gave me strength," Paul tells Timothy, referring to his mission. We all need strength to do the hard things in life, and I suspect, no matter how prepared we think we are, we all need strength when we face our own mortality. What I have often witnessed, not only with the Hebb's, but with so many who have lived that experience, is that when we are open to receiving it, God gives us strength also, to complete our mission. This strength comes through the care of others who surround us with love.

Miracles are not magic; they are so much bigger than that.
